Built for the paperwork behind the visit.

A medical practice runs on PDFs: referral letters routed to specialists, lab reports filed in the chart, insurance pre-authorization forms sent for approval, patient education handouts printed for the waiting room, chart exports mailed to another office. Scribe PDF covers what happens to every one of those documents between intake and follow-up.

Why on-device matters here: referral letters, lab reports, and chart exports are exactly the files that shouldn't round-trip through someone else's server. Every tool below runs locally, inside Apple's app sandbox. Nothing is uploaded to process a PDF.

Merge PDFs

[Create & Organize](#)

The referral packet needs one file, not four separate scans. Merge the intake form, the lab results, and the insurance authorization into a single PDF before it goes to the specialist.



Split PDF

[Create & Organize](#)

A 40-page hospital discharge record needs the medication list pulled out for the pharmacy and the follow-up plan pulled out for the primary care office, without re-scanning from the chart.



Images to PDF

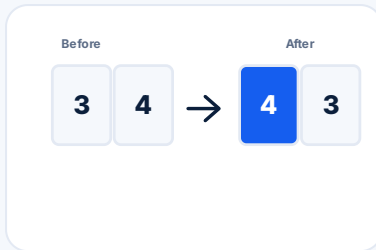
Fifteen photos of a scanned patient intake questionnaire become one clean PDF for the chart, with no separate scanner and no re-typing the answers by hand.



Clipboard to PDF

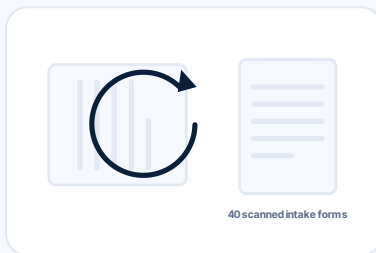
Copy a visit summary table straight out of the scheduling system and paste it into a one-page PDF for the referring office, without a screenshot tool in between.



Page Organiser

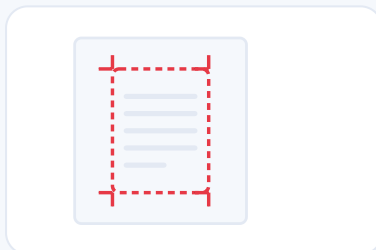
The new patient welcome packet came back from the printer with the consent form ahead of the insurance form; reorder the pages to match the intake checklist before it goes to the front desk.



Rotate Pages

[Create & Organize](#)

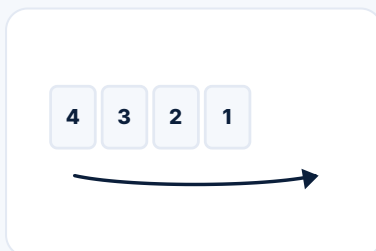
Half of the 40 scanned intake forms arrived sideways. Rotate every page back to portrait in one pass before they're filed in the chart.



Crop Pages

[Create & Organize](#)

A scanned referral letter has a wide margin from the fax machine; crop it to match the rest of the bound patient file.



Reverse Pages

[Create & Organize](#)

The scanner fed 30 pages of lab requisitions in reverse order. Flip the page order back to chronological sequence before they're filed.

Read & Extract

Get the results, the history, and the referral out of a PDF and into something usable.



OCR

Read & Extract

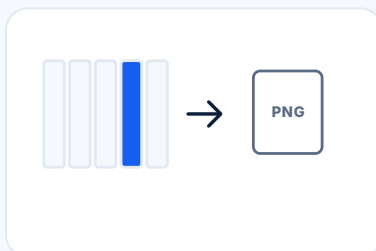
A five-year-old paper referral letter has to be referenced for a follow-up visit, but it's a photocopy. OCR turns it into real, selectable, searchable text before it goes in the patient's digital file.



Extract Text

Read & Extract

Pull just the follow-up instructions paragraph out of a 12-page discharge summary into plain text, ready to drop straight into the after-visit note without retyping.



Extract Pages

Read & Extract

Export only the lab results page from a 20-page hospital record as a clean PNG for the referral email, with no screenshotting and no re-opening the full chart.



Table Extraction

Read & Extract

A billing codes table is buried in a PDF export from the practice management system. Pull it straight into a real spreadsheet, cell by cell, instead of re-keying codes by hand.



Find in PDF

[Read & Extract](#)

Find every reference to a specific referring physician's name across a 90-page hospital transfer record before the follow-up visit: every match, across every page, in seconds.

Discharge summary, 9 pp.



Document Stats

[Read & Extract](#)

Check the page count, word count, and read time on a draft patient education handout before it's printed for the waiting room, a quick sanity check before it goes out.



PDF to Markdown

[Read & Extract](#)

Convert a specialist's referral letter PDF into clean Markdown so it drops straight into the practice's internal notes template, headings and bullet points intact.

Protect & Secure

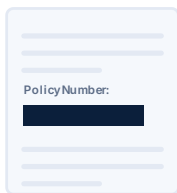
Lock what's confidential, remove what shouldn't travel, and prove what changed.



Password

Protect & Secure

Encrypt the individual patient's chart export before it's emailed to a specialist's office: real password protection, not a folder that just looks locked.



Redact

Protect & Secure

Black out the policy number and other identifying details on a sample case before it's shared for a teaching conference: gone for good, not just covered.



Watermark

Protect & Secure

Stamp "DRAFT, NOT FOR RELEASE" across every page of a preliminary discharge summary before it's reviewed by the attending.

Metadata

Protect & Secure

Set the Title, Author, and Visit Date fields correctly on the final referral summary before it's archived: the details a records search actually reads.

Strip Metadata

Protect & Secure

Strip the front desk's email address and internal file path out of a PDF before it's shared externally with a specialist's office.



Bates Number

Protect & Secure

Stamp MED-000001 through MED-003400 across every page of a large records-request response, sequential and consistent, the way legal counsel expects it.

Sign & Mark Up

Sign it, stamp it, mark it up, ready for the referral or the record.

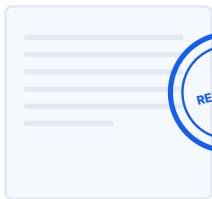

Sign & Mark Up

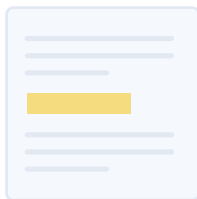
Fill in the prior authorization request fields and add a signature before the insurance deadline, with no printing, signing, or re-scanning.



Stamp Library

Sign & Mark Up

Stamp REVIEWED across the completed referral form the moment it's checked, before it moves to the front desk for mailing.



Follow-up
in 6 weeks:

Annotate

Sign & Mark Up

Highlight the follow-up date on a discharge summary and leave a note for the scheduler, directly on the record.



Headers & Footers

[Sign & Mark Up](#)

Add "Confidential: Patient Health Information" and automatic page numbers across a 20-page chart export before it's mailed to another office.



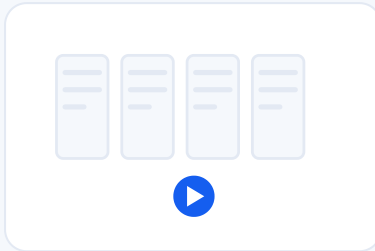
Compare PDFs

[Sign & Mark Up](#)

See exactly what changed between a patient's prior labs and the current results, side by side, before the follow-up visit.

Present & Listen

Take the update into the exam room, or into your commute.



Slideshow

Present & Listen

Present a case series full-screen at a continuing medical education session, straight from the PDF, with no separate deck to keep in sync with the handout.



Presenter Mode

Present & Listen

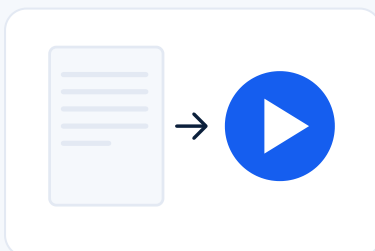
Walk a colleague through an imaging series with a laser pointer and on-slide markup, pointing straight at the finding that matters, during a case conference.



Read Aloud

Present & Listen

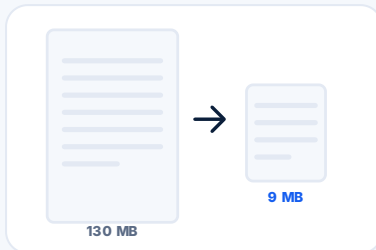
Have a 20-page journal article read aloud on the commute in, instead of squeezing the CME reading in before clinic starts.



PDF to Audiobook

Present & Listen

Turn a stack of continuing medical education articles into an MP3 for the commute, with the CME deadline closing in.



Compress PDF

[Optimize](#)

A 130MB scanned records batch from another office won't attach to an email. Compress it down to something that actually sends, without losing legibility.



Merge Layers

[Optimize](#)

Flatten the optional-content layers a scanning app leaves behind in its PDF export, so the lab report prints clean for the chart instead of blank.
