Built for the paperwork behind the matter.

A legal practice runs on PDFs: contracts drafted and redlined, NDAs routed for signature, discovery productions bound for opposing counsel, engagement letters sent to new clients, court filings, deposition exhibits. Scribe PDF covers what happens to every one of those documents between engagement and filing.

Why on-device matters here: privileged client files, settlement figures, and case strategy are exactly the documents that shouldn't round-trip through someone else's server. Every tool below runs locally, inside Apple's app sandbox. Nothing is uploaded to process a PDF.

Create & Organize

Assemble the matter file from whatever the negotiation actually produced.



Merge PDFs

Create & Organize

The closing binder needs one file, not six exports. Merge the purchase agreement, the title report, and the disclosure schedule into a single PDF for signature.



Split PDF

Create & Organize

A 90-page master services agreement needs the indemnification section pulled out for the insurance broker and the payment terms pulled out for accounting, without re-exporting from the drafting software.



Images to PDF

Create & Organize

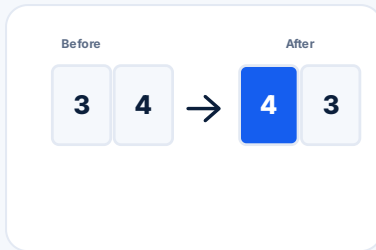
Twenty photos of a signed settlement agreement, taken page by page at the mediation, become one clean PDF for the file, with no separate scanner and no re-typing the signature block.



Clipboard to PDF

Create & Organize

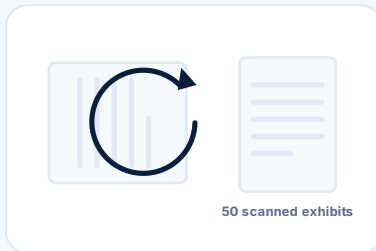
Copy a client intake table straight out of a case management tool and paste it into a one-page PDF for the file memo, without a screenshot tool in between.



Page Organiser

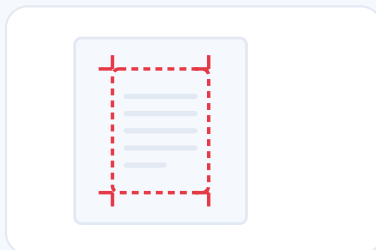
The discovery binder came back from the copy shop with the deposition exhibits ahead of the medical records; reorder the pages to match the exhibit list before it goes to opposing counsel.



Rotate Pages

[Create & Organize](#)

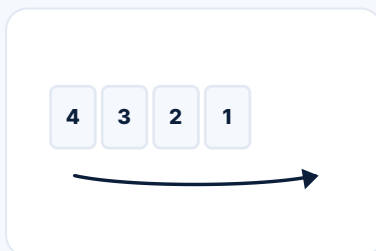
Half of the 50 scanned exhibits arrived sideways from the paralegal's scanner. Rotate every page back to portrait in one pass before the production goes out.



Crop Pages

[Create & Organize](#)

A scanned engagement letter has a wide margin from the courthouse copier; crop it to match the rest of the bound client file.



Reverse Pages

[Create & Organize](#)

The scanner fed 40 pages of a deposition transcript in reverse order. Flip the page order back to sequential before it's marked as an exhibit.

Read & Extract

Get the terms, the exhibits, and the argument out of a PDF and into something usable.



OCR

[Read & Extract](#)

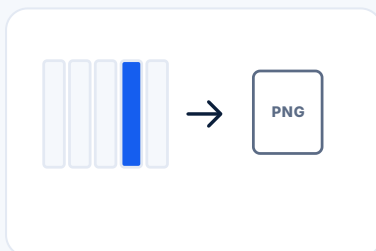
A decade-old paper lease has to be referenced in this year's renewal negotiation, but it's a photocopy. OCR turns it into real, selectable, searchable text before it goes in the matter file.



Extract Text

[Read & Extract](#)

Pull just the indemnification clause out of a 40-page vendor contract into plain text, ready to drop straight into the client memo without retyping.



Extract Pages

[Read & Extract](#)

Export only the signature page from a 30-page settlement agreement as a clean PNG for the closing checklist, with no screenshotting and no re-opening the full document.



Table Extraction

[Read & Extract](#)

A damages calculation table is buried in a PDF sent over by opposing counsel. Pull it straight into a real spreadsheet, cell by cell, instead of re-keying figures by hand.



Find in PDF

[Read & Extract](#)

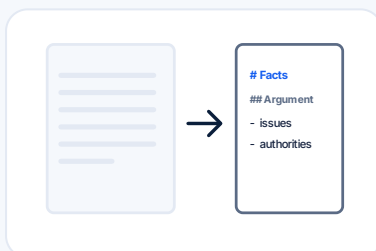
Find every reference to "force majeure" across a 300-page contract before the negotiation call: every match, across every page, in seconds.



Document Stats

[Read & Extract](#)

Check the page count, word count, and read time on a draft engagement letter before it goes to the client, a quick sanity check before the real review.



PDF to Markdown

[Read & Extract](#)

Convert a court's scheduling order PDF into clean Markdown so it drops straight into the internal case notes, headings and deadlines intact.

Protect & Secure

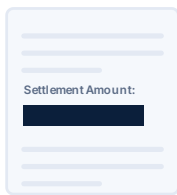
Lock what's privileged, remove what shouldn't travel, and prove what changed.



Password

Protect & Secure

Encrypt the client's financial disclosure before it's emailed to opposing counsel: real password protection, not a folder that just looks locked.



Redact

Protect & Secure

Black out the settlement amount and the client's home address on a copy of the agreement before a redacted version goes onto the court's public docket: gone for good, not just covered.



Watermark

Protect & Secure

Stamp "PRIVILEGED, DO NOT DISTRIBUTE" across every page of the draft opinion letter before it's shared with the client for review.

Metadata

Protect & Secure

Set the Title, Author, and Matter Number fields correctly on the final settlement agreement before it's archived: the details a document management search actually reads.

Strip Metadata

Protect & Secure

Strip the associate's name and internal file path out of a PDF before it's filed with the court.



Bates Number

Protect & Secure

Stamp LAW-000001 through LAW-004820 across every page of a discovery production, sequential and consistent, the way opposing counsel expects it.

Sign & Mark Up

Sign it, stamp it, mark it up, ready for opposing counsel or the court.

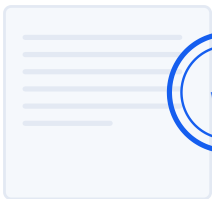

Fill & Sign

Sign & Mark Up

Fill in the engagement letter fields and add a signature before the retainer deadline, with no printing, signing, or re-scanning.



Stamp Library

Sign & Mark Up

Stamp FILED across the final motion the moment it's accepted by the clerk, before it moves into the matter file.

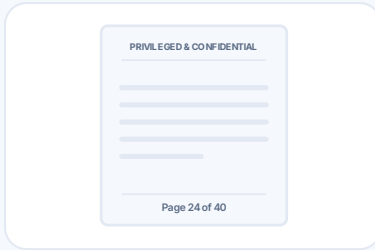

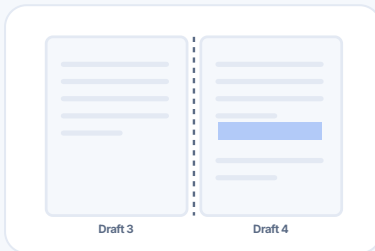
Highlight the indemnity clause that changed since the last redline and leave a comment for the associate, directly on the agreement.



Headers & Footers

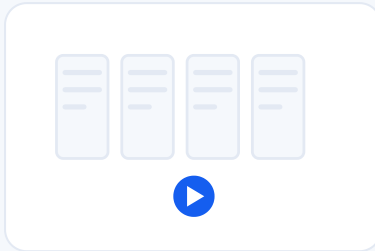
Add "Privileged & Confidential, Attorney Work Product" and automatic page numbers across a 60-page memo before it goes out for internal distribution.



Compare PDFs

[Sign & Mark Up](#)

See exactly what changed between draft 3 and draft 4 of the purchase agreement, side by side, before presenting the redline to the client.



Slideshow

[Present & Listen](#)

Present the exhibit timeline full-screen to the trial team, straight from the PDF, with no separate deck to keep in sync with the trial binder.



Presenter Mode

[Present & Listen](#)

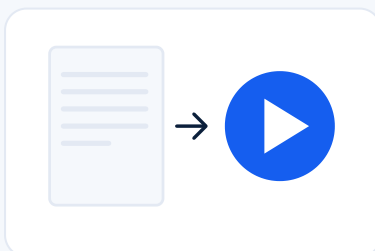
Walk the client through the settlement terms with a laser pointer and on-slide markup, pointing straight at the clause that matters.



Read Aloud

[Present & Listen](#)

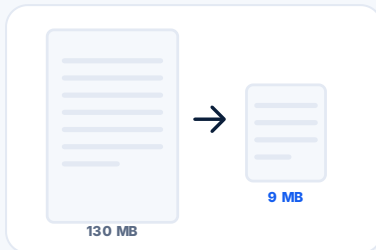
Have a 20-page vendor contract read aloud on the commute in, instead of squeezing the reading in before the negotiation call.



PDF to Audiobook

[Present & Listen](#)

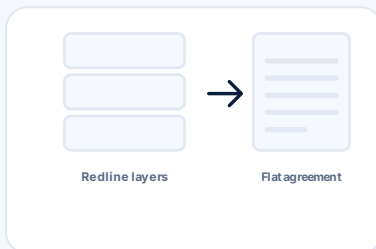
Turn the continuing legal education reading into an MP3 for the commute, with the credit deadline closing in.



Compress PDF

[Optimize](#)

A 130MB scanned discovery batch from opposing counsel won't attach to an email. Compress it down to something that actually sends, without losing legibility.



Merge Layers

[Optimize](#)

Flatten the optional-content layers a drafting tool leaves behind in its PDF export, so the redline prints clean for the file instead of blank.
