Built for the paperwork behind the lesson.

A classroom runs on PDFs: worksheets prepped the night before, rubrics handed out with an assignment, permission slips sent home, report cards, IEP documentation, parent emails. Scribe PDF covers what happens to every one of those documents between lesson planning and the report card.

Why on-device matters here: student records and IEP paperwork are exactly the files that shouldn't round-trip through someone else's server. Every tool below runs locally, inside Apple's app sandbox. Nothing is uploaded to process a PDF.

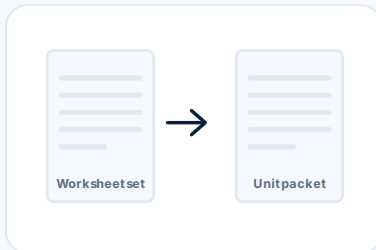

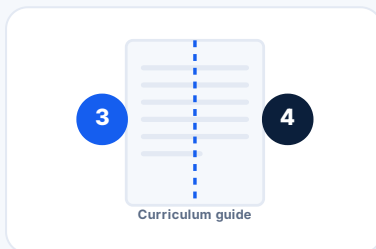

Merge PDFs

[Create & Organize](#)

The unit packet needs one file, not five separate downloads. Merge the worksheet, the rubric, and the answer key into a single PDF for the class folder.



Split PDF

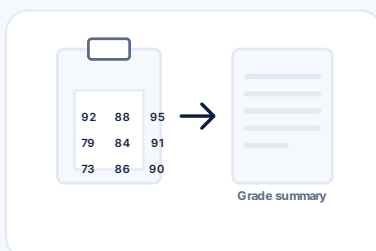
A 60-page curriculum guide needs the reading section pulled out for one class and the lab section pulled out for another, without re-exporting from the planning software.



Images to PDF

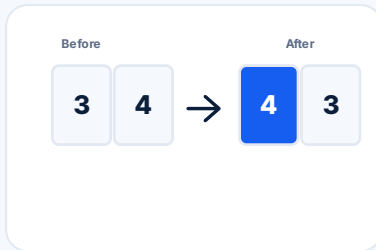
Twenty photos of whiteboard notes from today's lesson become one clean PDF for the class folder, with no separate scanner and no re-typing the notes.



Clipboard to PDF

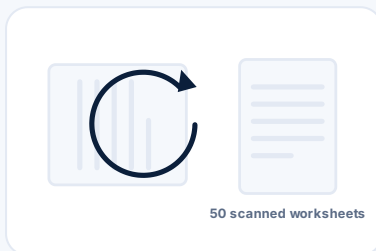
Copy a grade summary straight out of the gradebook and paste it into a one-page PDF for a parent conference, without a screenshot tool in between.



Page Organiser

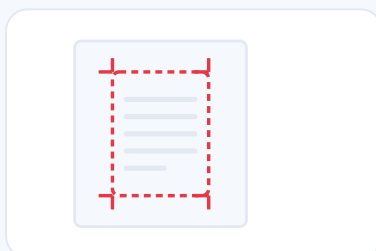
The unit packet came back from the copier with the vocabulary sheet ahead of the reading passage; reorder the pages to match the lesson sequence before it's printed for the class.



Rotate Pages

[Create & Organize](#)

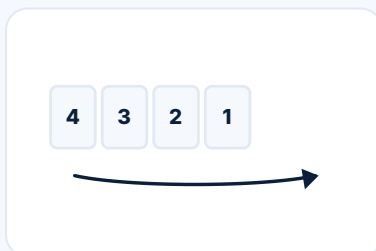
Half of the 50 scanned worksheets came back sideways from the copier. Rotate every page back to portrait in one pass before they're filed.



Crop Pages

[Create & Organize](#)

A scanned permission slip has a wide margin from the school's photocopier; crop it to match the rest of the bound parent packet.



Reverse Pages

[Create & Organize](#)

The scanner fed 30 pages of quizzes in reverse order. Flip the page order back to sequence before they're handed back to students.

Read & Extract

Get the reading, the rubric, and the notes out of a PDF and into something usable.



OCR

[Read & Extract](#)

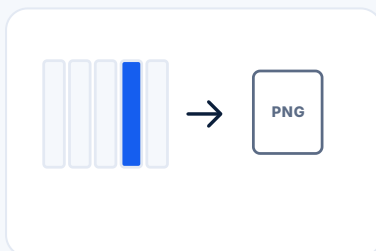
An old photocopied worksheet needs to be reused for this year's unit, but it's just a scanned image. OCR turns it into real, selectable, searchable text before it goes back in the lesson folder.



Extract Text

[Read & Extract](#)

Pull just the grading criteria paragraph out of a 15-page rubric into plain text, ready to drop straight into the gradebook comments without retyping.



Extract Pages

[Read & Extract](#)

Export only the vocabulary slide from a 40-page unit deck as a clean PNG for the class website, with no screenshotting and no re-opening the slide file.



Table Extraction

[Read & Extract](#)

A grade breakdown table is buried in a PDF export from the gradebook platform. Pull it straight into a real spreadsheet, cell by cell, instead of re-keying scores by hand.



Find in PDF

[Read & Extract](#)

Find every reference to "photosynthesis" across a 150-page textbook chapter before building the quiz: every match, across every page, in seconds.

Unit study guide, 12 pp.



Document Stats

[Read & Extract](#)

Check the page count, word count, and read time on a reading passage before assigning it, a quick sanity check before it goes home in the folder.



PDF to Markdown

[Read & Extract](#)

Convert a district curriculum PDF into clean Markdown so it drops straight into the shared lesson-planning doc, headings and bullet points intact.

Protect & Secure

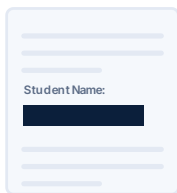
Lock what's private, remove what shouldn't travel, and prove what changed.



Password

Protect & Secure

Encrypt a student's IEP documentation before it's emailed to the case manager: real password protection, not a folder that just looks locked.



Redact

Protect & Secure

Black out a student's name and identifying details on a sample assignment before sharing it with colleagues at a department meeting: gone for good, not just covered.



Watermark

Protect & Secure

Stamp "DRAFT, NOT FOR DISTRIBUTION" across every page of a preliminary syllabus before it's shared with the department.

Protect & Secure

Set the Title, Author, and Grade Level fields correctly on the final study guide before it's archived: the details a shared drive search actually reads.

Strip Metadata

Protect & Secure

Strip the teacher's personal email and internal file path out of a worksheet PDF before it's posted publicly on the class website.



Bates Number

Protect & Secure

Stamp TCH-000001 through TCH-000860 across every page of an IEP documentation binder for a district compliance review, sequential and consistent, the way the review team expects it.

Sign & Mark Up

Sign it, stamp it, mark it up, ready for the family or the front office.

Permission Slip

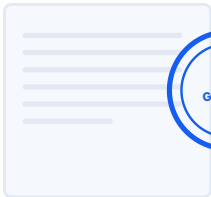

Sign & Mark Up

Fill in the field trip permission slip fields and add a signature before the deadline, with no printing, signing, or re-scanning.



Stamp Library

Sign & Mark Up

Stamp GRADED across a completed assignment the moment it's checked, before it's handed back.

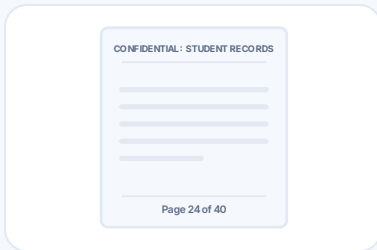

Add "Confidential: Student Records" and automatic page numbers across a 40-page IEP packet before it goes out to the front office.



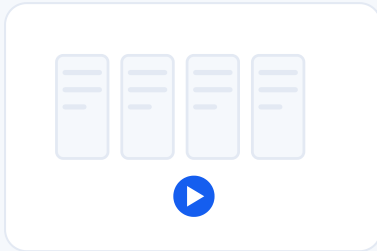
Compare PDFs

Take the lesson into the classroom, or into your commute.

Present & Listen

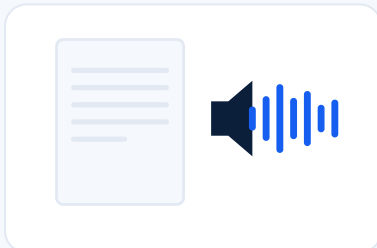
Present the unit overview full-screen to the class, straight from the PDF, with no separate deck to keep in sync with the handout.



Presenter Mode

Present & Listen

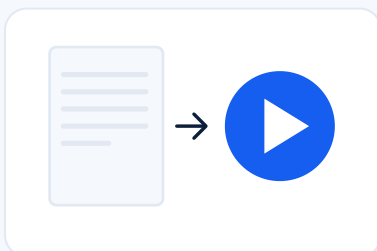
Walk the class through the grading rubric with a laser pointer and on-slide markup, pointing straight at the criterion that matters.



Read Aloud

Present & Listen

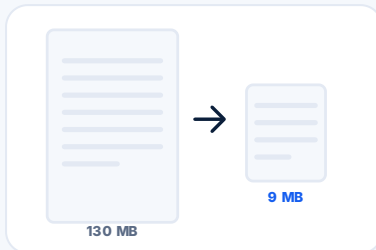
Have a reading passage read aloud during independent work time, instead of reading it out loud to the whole class.



PDF to Audiobook

Present & Listen

Turn a textbook chapter into an MP3 for the commute in, with grading still waiting at the end of the day.



Compress PDF

[Optimize](#)

A 130MB scanned packet of student work won't attach to an email. Compress it down to something that actually sends, without losing legibility.



Merge Layers

[Optimize](#)

Flatten the optional-content layers a scanning app leaves behind in its PDF export, so the worksheet prints clean for the packet instead of blank.
